Upon consideration of the foregoing petition for naturalization, including the affidavit of petitioner's verifying witnesses and the official evidence of his service in the military or naval forces of the United States, and said petitioner having taken the required oath of renunciation and allegiance before me, it is hereby ordered that the said petitioner be, and he hereby is, admitted to become a citizen of the United States of America, on this 11th day of March Anno Domini 1945, at Paris, France (and that his name be changed to _____).

Be it known that Angelos Spero Klonis then residing at Mayflower Cafe, Santa Fe, New Mexico petitioned to be admitted a citizen of the United States of America, which petition was heard by me on March 11, 1945, at Paris, France; and having found that the petitioner intends to reside permanently in the United States, had in all other respects complied with the applicable provisions of the Naturalization Laws of the United States, and was entitled to be admitted, I thereupon ordered that the petitioner be admitted as a citizen of the United States of America.
